DEPUTY MINISTER THE RAILWAYS AND TRANSPORT (SHRI O. V. ALAGESAN): (a) At present only one Annapurna Dining Car is running on railways on the Weekly Janata Express between Delhi and Madras.

(b) The service is run by the All India Women's Food Council, and Government are not aware of the amount of profits made. No profits accrue to the railway.
