

(b) in what proportion this expenditure is to be borne by the participating States and the Centre; and

(c) what is the amount expected to be raised as betterment levy in connection with this project?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR IRRIGATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S. L. HATHI): (a) The revised estimate for the project is under examination by Government. A statement giving the actual expenditure incurred up to the 31st October 1953 by major heads is laid on the Table of the Council.

(b) No expenditure is borne by the Centre. The allocation of cost of the project between the participating States will be in proportion to the benefits accruing to each State.

(c) Of the order of Rs. 120 crores as estimated by the project authorities.

at the invitation of the Government of India in order to assist them in devising a plan and programme for the development of village and small-scale industries in the country; and

(b) if so, how long this study tour will last and who will bear the expenses of this tour?

(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The tour will last for about 10 weeks. The expenses will be met by the Ford Foundation.

FILM ENQUIRY COMMITTEE REPORT
