(b) the number of trainees in each of the training centres and the places where these centres are located;

(c) (i) how many more training centres are needed;

(ii) for how many persons; and

(iii) at what places: and

(d) the number of unskilled manpower required to assist the skilled labour for this service?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR IRRI-GATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S. L. HATHI): (a) and (b). Statements are placed on the Table. [See Appendix V, Annexure No. 42.]

(c) The existing Extension Training and Social Education Organisers Training Centres are considered adequate.

(d) It is not possible to indicate this now as it will depend largely on the peoples' programme in 'the various areas.

SCHEMES FROM MYSORE GOVERNMENT FOR INCLUSION IN FIVE YEAR PLAN

77. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for Planning be pleased to state:

(a) the schemes recommended by the Government of Mysore for inclusion in the Five Year Plan;

(b) the schemes (i) which have been accepted and (ii) which have not been accepted by the Planning Commission out of the schemes so recommended;

(c) who is managing the schemes not accepted by the Planning Commission;

(d) if no one has undertaken to work the schemes, when they will be taken up again; and

(e) the reasons for not accepting the schemes for inclusion in the Plan or for postponing them?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR IRRI-GATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S. L. HATHI): (a) and (b). After the discussion with the Planning Commission in 1951 the Government of Mysore furnished a list of schemes to be included in the State Plan. They have been published in the Supplementary Volume (Development Schemes) to the Final Report of the Planning Commission. Subsequently the State Government approached the Planning Commission for inclusion of a few other schemes in the Plan. A statement of schemes referred to the Planning Commission but not included in the Plan is placed on the Table of the House. [See Appendix V, Annexure No. 43.]

(c) to (e). Only schemes possessing high priority which could be financed, in the Plan period, within the financial resources available could be included in the Plan. A scheme outside the Plan can be included if the Government concerned can show that additional resources can be made available.

INDIA'S SELF-SUFFICIENCY IN CLOTH

78. SHRIMATI SAVITRY NIGAM: Will the Minister for COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to state whether India is self-supporting in the matter of cloth?

THE MINISTER FOR COMMERCE (SHRI D. P. KARMARKAR): Yes.

## ENGAGEMENTS OF CRIMINALS IN THE COMMUNITY PROJECTS

79. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for PLANNING be pleased to state whether Government propose to employ persons convicted of crimes in the community projects?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR IRRI-GATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S. L. HATHI): This is primarily a matter for State Governments. Some of them are considering such a proposal.
