MOVEMENT OF THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR ASIA AND FAR EAST TO INDIA

87. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state whether Government have invited the Economic Commission for Asia and Far East to shift its headquarters to India?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINIS-EXTERNAL AFFAIRS TER FOR AND DEFENCE (SHRI JAWAHARLAJ. NEHRU): Yes. Sir.

DEMAND FOR SAMBHAR LAKE SALT

- 88. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for Production be pleased to state.
- (a) whether there is a wide-spread demand for Sambhar Lake salt in India; and
- (b) if so, what measures have been adopted to improve its production?

THE MINISTER FOR PRODUCTION (SHRI K. C. REDDY): (a) There is good demand for Sambhar salt in Rajasthan, East Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, North Bihar, Madhya Bharat, Kashmir and Nepal.

(b) Salt production at Sambhar Lake sources, specially at Sambhar, is dependant on rainfall. To supplement production, salt is manufactured also from subterranean brine. The number of pans and kuls has been increased to achieve an increase in production. Further, the three percolation canals at Gudha, Nawa and Deodani, which form the chief source of supply of subterranean brine, are being desilted and cleaned up to ensure a copious supply of brine. To meet the situation in the event of failure of rains and to procure larger quantities of subterranean brine, it is proposed to carry out a survey of the Lake with a view to locating all the sources of subsoil brine.
