SHRI M. VALIULLA: How many members have attended these conferences altogether?

MR. CHAIRMAN: From outside or from inside?

SHRI M. VALIULLA: From outside, Sir.

SHRIMATI LAKSHMI MENON: We have got the total for each conference, but not the number of outsiders.

BOARDS SET UP UNDER THE FIVE YEAR PLAN

*265. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for PLANNING be pleased to state:

(a) how many committees and boards are proposed to be set up under the Five Year Plan; and

(b) out of them how many have been set up so far?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR PLANNING AND IRRIGATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S. L. HATHI) : (a) and (b). There is already a Planning Commission Advisory Board as well as a special Advisory Board on public co-operation programme. There are also 11 panels dealing with special subjects under the Planning Commission Advi-

sory Board. It cannot be said now as to how many committees and boards will be set up in future.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Is it not envisaged in the Plan that you will have a Khadi Board?

SHRI J. S. L. HATHI: It is envisaged; but I cannot say how many other boards will be constituted now.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: But have they not already started or constituted one or two boards envisaged in the Plan?

SHRI J. S. L. HATHI: Only one or two boards.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: He could have given that answer before.

SHRI J. S. L. HATHI: But he already knew it.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: May I know how many boards are likely to be set up as per the Plan?

SHRI J. S. L. HATHI: I am not in a position to say that, just now.

BUILDING IN NEW DELHI

*266. SHRI M. VALIULLA: (a) Will the Minister for WORKS, HOUSING AND SUPPLY be pleased to state the total number of buildings owned by (i) Government; and (ii) private agencies or people in New Delhi?

(b) Whether there are any housing societies, associations or corporations in New Delhi which receive Government aid to promote house construction?

THE MINISTER FOR WORKS, HOUSING AND SUPPLY (SARDAR SWARAN SINGH) : (a) The information asked for by the hon. Member is not readily available, nor is it possible to make an enumeration of this type as the expression 'building' used in the question cannot be easily defined. From the information collected so far, it can be stated that buildings owned by Government number about 34,200 and others number about 7,500.

(b) No, Sir.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Out of these 7,000 and odd buildings that have been constructed may I know how many are owned by individuals and how many by associations or corporations or societies?

SARDAR SWARAN SINGH: I will refer the hon. Member to the question he has put and the answer that has been given. They relate to the categories which he has enumerated in his question in part (a).

SHRI RAJAGOPAL NAIDU: Is there any house-building co-operative society within Delhi limits?

MR. CHAIRMAN: He asks whether there are house-building co-operative societies within the limits of Delhi.

SARDAR SWARAN SINGH: There are some of them Sir, but they have not yet started functioning actively.

SHRI RAJAGOPAL NAIDU: May I point out to the hon. Minister that there are advertisements in the daily papers asking for applications to join as members of these societies?

SARDAR SWARAN SINGH: That is right.

SHRI GOVINDA REDDY: Is there not an all-India house-building association in Delhi?

SARDAR SWARAN SINGH: Not that I know of.
