## OralAnswen USE OF SCRAP STEEL

- \*5. SHRIOSMANSOBHANI: Will the Minister for COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to state:
- (a) the number of lactones in India that use scrap steel for conversion into .-structural or alloy steel;
- (£>) what is the quantity and value of the scrap steel so used;
- (c) what is the proportion of scrap steel used in India to the quantity of .scrap steel exported;
- (d) what is the controlled price per ton of scrap steel supplied to Indian : factories /
- (e) whether Government are taking any steps to encourage the existing factories to use the maximum quantity of scrap steel; and
- (/) whether Government are doing anything to encourage the extension of existing factories or the establishment of new factories?

THE MINISTER FOR COMMERCE (SHRI D. P. KARMARKAR): (a) 12.

- (b) About 29,200 tons per month, •valued at approximately Rs. 17 1/2 lakhs.
- (c) In 1951-52, the quantity used in India was about 8 times that exported. It may, however, be noted that only such varieties of scrap as cannot be used in India, are allowed to be **■**exported.
- (d) About Rs. 60 per ton on the average at ports.
  - (e) Yes, Sir.
- (/) Yes; permission to extend existing electric furnace capacity or to install new furnaces is freely given.

SHRI GOVINDA REDDY: Has this fact come to the notice of the Government that Japan has decided to set up two international trading centres in India?

SHRI D. P. KARMARKAR: That has not yet come to my notice. But I will look into the matter.

## EXPORT OF SCRAP IRON

- \*7. SHRI C. G. K. REDDY: Will the Minister for COMMERCE AND IN-DUSTRY be pleased to state:
- (a) the total quantity of scrap iron exported during the last six months; and
- (b) the quantity and value of pig iron and mild steel imported during the same period?

THE MINISTER FOR COMMERCE (SHRI D. P. KARMARKAR ) : (a) 1,46,506 tons during the six months ending September 1952. Only such scrap as cannot be used in India is allowed to be exported.

- (b) 20 tons of special grade pig iron of value Rs. 13,503 and 77,000 tons of mild steel of value Rs. 682,25,000.
- SHRI C. G. K. REDDY: Am I to understand from the hon. Minister's answer that the total amount of scrap iron used by the Indian factories was eight times 146 thousand tons during the last six months?

SHRID.P.K\RMARK\R:I should think so.
