## DEPOSITS IN POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS

- (a) when was the maximum limit of deposits raised from Rs. 10,000 to Rs. 15,000 for an individual account in the post office savings banks;
- (b) how many persons have increased their deposits after that date; and
  - (c) what is the amount of the increase?

THE MINISTER FOR COMMUNI-CATIONS (SHRI JAGJIVAN RAM): (a) The maximum limit was raised with effect from the 1st April 1952.

(b) and (c). The amount cf labour and expense involved will be out of proportion to the usefulness of the information.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Has it been increased to Rs. 30,000 in the case of joint accounts?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR):
