IMPORT OF RAW SILK

- I. SHRI KRISHNA MOORTHY RAO: Will the Minister for COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to state:
- (a) the quantity of raw silk imported into India from different countries during the years 1950 and 1951; and
- (b) the quantity for which import licences have been issued for the year 1952?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI D. P. KARMARKAR):

- (a) 1950 . . 7.12,596 lbs. 1951 . . 12,14,644 lbs.
- (b) Licences are issued in terms of value only and the value of import licences for the raw silk issued upto March 1952 for the current licensing period (January—June 1952) amounts to Rs. 13,26,496. The quantity would be roughly 60,000 lbs.

PROTECTION TO SILK INDUSTRY

- (a) whether Government are aware that the Tariff Board recommended protection, to the Indian silk industry?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI D. P. KARMARKAR): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The Government have already issued a Gazette Notification containing protection till the end of 1952.

IMPORT LICENCES FOR SILK

- (a) whether Government are aware that the silk seminar organised by the Government of Mysore unanimously recommended a central import and distribution system with a view to pool local and foreign silk; and

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI D. P. KARMARKAR): (a) Yes.

(b) The recommendation in question was submitted to Government in a modified form by the Standing Committee of the Central Silk Board. The modified recommendation was mainly to the effect that import licences for raw silk should be granted only on the recommendation of State Govern-The present licensing procedure largely meets this modified recommendation and Government have Secretary, Central Silk informed Board accordingly.
