(4) When the existing entitlements are more-favourable, they will be paid in all cases.

COMPULSORY MILITARY TRAINING FOR STUDENTS IN THE COUNTRY

261. SHRI M. M. DHARIA: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state whether Government are considering any scheme to impart compulsory Military Training to all the students in the various Universities in the Country?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI Y. B. CHAVAN): The Universities in India have, under their own powers made N.C.C. training a compulsory subject for all able-bodied boys of undergraduate classes. Training and administrative arrangements have been made by the Directorate General, N.C.C.
