(b) and (c) The Government launched a Special Recruitment Drive in November, 2008 to fill up the backlog vacancies reserved for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes in Central Government establishments. As per the information received from 73 Ministries/Departments a total of 77487 backlog vacancies were identified for the Drive of which 25560 were for SCs, 28542 for STs and 23385 for OBCs. Out of these vacancies, 10236 of SCs, 8104 of STs and 8102 of OBCs have been filled up. It was stipulated that all the backlog vacancies would be filled up by June, 2011. However, since a large number of backlog vacancies still remains unfilled, the Drive has been relaunched. All the Ministries/Departments have been requested to fill up the remaining backlog vacancies by 31.03.2012.
