## Immunization for children

\*291. DR. JANARDHAN WAGHMARE: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is aware that more than 55 per cent of children in the age group of 0-2 years do not receive comprehensive immunization in the country;
  - (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether due to lack of facilities for immunization of children, they either die or suffer from major diseases; and
- (d) if so, the steps taken by the Central Government, in consultation with the State Governments, to protect children from various diseases?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI GHULAM NABI AZAD): (a) and (b) As per Health Information Management System (HIMS) percentage of fully immunized children in 2010-11 reported by States is 87.2%. Evaluated coverage by Coverage Evaluation Survey (CES) 2009 was 61%.

- (c) As per the available data from Central Bureau of Health Intelligence, the number of vaccine preventable diseases has shown a declining trend.
  - (d) The following steps have been taken to achieve universal immunization:

The Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) is funded by Government of India. Besides supply of the required vaccines, support is provided for the following:

- Alternate vaccine delivery for supply of vaccine from the last storage point to the villages and outreach session sites.
- Support for hiring vaccinators in urban slums and underserved areas to ensure that planned immunization sessions are held.
- Financial incentives to more than 8 lakh ASHAs who mobilize children for immunization sessions.
- Mobility Support to state and districts to facilitate supportive supervision.
- Printing of monitoring tools, preparation of micro-plans, quarterly review meetings, training of health workers and for safe injection waste disposal.
- Cold chain maintenance and for any other State specific requirements.

In addition, Government of India supplies cold chain equipments required for immunization programme to States and UTs.
