Development and expansion of telecom in rural areas

SHRI RAM JETHMALANI:

Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that private sector companies are working on many projects under Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF) for development and expansion of telecom in rural areas of the country;
- (b) if so, the names of these companies and the projects assigned to them and the cost of these projects; and
- (c) whether the works of each of these projects have been completed as per the targets set?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (SHRI MILIND DEORA): (a) Yes, Sir. Universal Service Providers, including private sector companies are contracted under following schemes of Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF):

- (i) Shared Mobile Infrastructure for setting up of infrastructure sites (mobile tower sites) and provisioning of mobile services using these sites; and
- (ii) Provision of Rural Community Phones.
- (b) The names of companies contracted under above Schemes of Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF) and estimated cost of the scheme are given in Statement (See below).
- (c) The work under the scheme of provisioning of Rural Community Phones has been completed as per the target set. However, there have been delays in implementation of Shared Mobile Infrastructure Scheme of USOF. 61 out of 7353 mobile towers and about 6600 out of 22007 Base Transceiver Stations are yet to be set up under the scheme.

The Government has also set up a Committee on 15th July, 2011 under the Chairmanship of Secretary (Telecom) to consider all aspects of delay in rollout of mobile services under Shared Mobile Infrastructure Scheme of USOF and suggest appropriate action that may be required to be taken in the facts and circumstances of the cases. The Committee has submitted its report recently and the same is under examination.
