

Closure of Four CPSUs in West Bengal

837. SHRIMATI CHANDRA KALA PANDEY: Will the Minister of HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the new-item captioned Kendra ne jhoot bola... appeared in Jansatta (Calcutta edition), dated 14th July, 2000 regarding closure of four CPSUs in West Bengal;

(b) if so, whether the expert Committee had recommended to explore the possibilities of revival of Weighbird, MAMC and RIC through various options, are reported;

(c) if so, the details of the efforts made by Government to explore the possibilities; and

(d) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES (DR. VALLABHBHAI KATHIRIA): (a) to (d) Govt. has taken a decision to take action for closure of six unviable PSEs including MAMC, RIC and Weighbird after considering the recommendations of the Export Group about the unviability of the companies as PSUs and taken into account that the earlier efforts for revival through other options including privatisation/joint venture formation have not been successful. These PSEs were facing the possibility of winding up consequent to the preliminary/final view of BIFR/Expert Agency. However, in order to mitigate the hardship of employees in these PSEs, Govt. have decided to introduce Voluntary Separation Scheme (VSS) and offer VRS benefits which would be substantially higher than the compensation available under the ID Act in the event of winding up.
