Deaths due to diarrhoea

†878. SHRI KAPTAN SINGH SOLANKI: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that according to a reputed medical journal, Lancet, of Britain thousands of children in the country die due to diarrhoea;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether it is also a fact that India is one of the nations where vaccine to control diarrhoea caused by rotavirus is not included in the National Vaccination Campaign; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI SUDIP BANDYOPADHYAY): (a) and (b) According to report published in Lancet (October, 2011), it is estimated that India accounts for 22% of deaths globally due to diarrhoea attributable to Rota virus infection. The estimates mentioned in report are based on extrapolations of the meta-analysis of hospital based studies and not on community

representative sample. These estimates are not representative of the whole country as they have been carried out in few areas. Rotaviruses are present in normal children, this can affect the results. The authors themselves have mentioned several limitations of their study including overestimation of rotavirus related mortality.

(c) and (d) At present, Rotavirus vaccination is not a part of National Immunization Programme. However, the Department of Biotechnology is supporting development of a low cost rotavirus vaccine within the country through public-private partnership.

Wasteful expenditure of NRHM fund in Bihar

†879. SHRI RAJNITI PRASAD: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) the funds allocated to Bihar under National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) during the current financial year;

(b) the manner in which it is ensured that the funds allocated under the scheme is being spent under the assigned head and it is not utilized in wasteful expenditure;

(c) whether any information regarding wasteful expenditure of allocated funds has come to Government's notice; and

(d) if so, the action taken against persons responsible for wasteful expenditure and mismanagement?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI SUDIP BANDYOPADHYAY): (a) to (d) An amount of Rs, 1122.10 crore has been allocated to Bihar under National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) during the current Financial Year 2011-12.

Quarterly Financial Management Reports are received from the State on a regular basis and are analysed to review trend of expenditure under various activities. The observations and deficiencies and the Ministry's comments on progress of expenditure in accordance with approved heads of the Programme Implementation Plan are communicated to the State for taking appropriate remedial measures. Periodical visits are undertaken by the Ministry's teams to States to monitor the progress of NRHM implementation in the field.

No case of any wasteful expenditure of allocated funds has been brought to the notice of the Government.
