(ख) और (ग) हम तो इस बात में विश्वास करत हैं कि इस क्षेत्र के देशों की मुरक्षा अंततः उनकी अपनी राष्ट्रीय शक्ति पर और प्रभुसत्ता प्राप्त तथा स्वतंत्र राज्यों के रूप में एक-दूसरे के स्वेच्छ या सहयोग पर ही निर्भर होनी चाहिए।

BHAGAT) : (a) On 16th January, 1968 the British Prime Minister announced in the House of Commons that Britain had decided to withdraw its existing military presence east of Suez by 1971. He had also announced earlier that plans to develop Aldabra island had been given up.

(b) and (c) We believe that the security of the countries in the region must rest ultimately on their own national strength, and on their willing cooperation between one another as Sovereign independent States.]

Government would naturally view such happenings with horror and condemn such atrocities. Their representatives have been consistently demanding the early end of the illegal minority regime of Rhodesia and drawing world's attention to its atrocities.
