PRICES OF AUTOMOBILES

1291. SHRI SITARAM JAIPU-RIA:

SHRI R. P. KHAITAN:

Will the Minister of INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND COMPANY AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the high prices of automobiles are due to heavy taxation at all levels of production in the country;
- (b) if so, whether it is a fact that 40 per cent to 48 per cent of the car price goes to the Government as taxes:

- (c) whether it is a fact that foreign collaboration in private sector for the manufacture of cars is not permitted, and if so, the reasons therefor;
- (d) the names of the foreign collaborators, if any in private sector at present; and
- (e) what steps are being taken to check the prices of cars?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND COMPANY AFFAIRS (SHRI FAKHRUDDIN ALI AHMED): (a) and (b) Taxes and duties account for a significant portion of the selling price of automobiles manufactured in the country. In the case of the three makes of passenger cars, the incidence of such levies ranges from 28.6% to 36% of the ex-showroom price in Delhi.

- (c) It is not a fact that foreign collaboration is not permitted for the manufacture of cars in the private sector.
- (d) The names of the foreign collaborators in the private sector at present are as under:—

Government have impressed on the manufacturers the need to ensure economy in production and bring down costs and prices of automobiles. The Tariff Commission has also been requested to determine reasonable selling prices of passenger cars manufactured in the country and further action in this regard will be taken after receipt of the report of the Tariff Commission.
