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Appendix LXV, Annexure Nos. 113 and 114 for (c) and (d).] India maintains 98 Missions and Posts abroad. The budgetary provision for these for the year 1968-69 is of the order of Rs. 10.38 crores. While efforts are constantly made to keep expenditure to the minimum despite rising costs, the overall amount spent is modest when one takes into account our interests, the need for reciprocity and the position which our country occupies in the world today. By means of periodic inspection, needs of economy and efficiency are continuously kept under review.

(a) whether it is a fact that the State Plan Advisory Council of Uttar Pradesh at its recent meeting criticised the Central leaders for inadequate allocations of funds for various plans of the State;

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF PLANNING (SHRI-MATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) Some of the Members of the Plan Advisory Council felt that U.P. had not received adequate assistance in the past. (b) Attention is invited to pages 94-95 of the 'Annual Plan 1968-69' placed on the Table of the House in July, 1968.

The Fourth Plan proposals of the State Government have not yet been received.

(c) The proposal of the State Government to increase the outlay for the current year's Plan on the basis of the State's own resources will be considered some time in October, 1968.

As regards the Fourth Plan, the question does not arise at this stage.
