785. SHRI SALIL KUMAR GANGULI: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:

- (a) what is the quantity of Bisphenol A and epichlorohydrin consumed and produced annually in India and the names of the producers; and
- (b) what was the quantity of Bisphenol A and epichlorohydrin imported from each country during the year 1975?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI B. P. MAURYA): (a) Bisphenol 'A' is produced by two units in the organised sector viz., Messrs. Cibatul Limited, Bulsar and Messrs. Piramal Organic Chemicals Limited, Bombay and also by three small units in the small scale sector. The total production and consumption is about 374 tonnes per annum.

Epichlorohydrin is not being produced in the country at present and the entire demand is met by imports. The import of epichlorohydrin during 1975 was about 66.8 tonnes.

†Extension of Credit Guarantee Scheme to cover small-scale ancillary units

786. SHRI JANARDHANA REDDY: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government have taken a decision to extend the Credit Guarantee Scheme to cover small-scale ancillary units; and
 - (b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Hitherto the Credit Guarantee Scheme for Small scale industries covered only such industrial undertakings in which the investment in plant and machinery was not in excess of Rs. 7.5 lakhs in line with the general definition of "small scale industries". The general definition of "small scale industries" and "ancillary industries" was revised in May 1975 by raising the ceiling on investment in plant and machinery to Rs. 10 lakhs and Rs. 15 lakhs in the case of "small scale industries" and industries' respectively. 'ancillary facility of Credit Guarantee Scheme was, however, extended in August 1975 to all undertakings having investment in plant and machinery not exceeding Rs. 10 lakhs, irrespective of the fact whether the unit

is 'small scale industry' or 'ancillary industry'. Cn further consideration the facility of Credit Guarantee scheme has been extended to cover 'ancilarry units' with investment in plant and machinery beyond Rs. 10 lakhs but not exceeding Rs. 15 lakhs in line with the general definition of 'ancillary industries'.

Sugar Cooperatives

- (a) The number of sugar cooperatives, in different States, with their fixed assets financed from their internal resources;
- (b) the number of sugar cooperatives running at a loss; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI A. C. GEORGE): (a) 97 cooperative sugar factories were in production during the sugar season 1974-75. A State-wise statement regarding the number of cooperative sugar factories and their fixed assets covered by internal resources is enclosed. [See Appendix XCV, Annexure No. 60].

- (b) Information is available only in respect of cooperative sugar factories in production on 30th June, 1974. Of the 91 cooperative sugar factories in production, 36 incurred losses during the year ended 30th June, 1974.
- (c) The amounts contributed by the State Governments to the share-capital of cooperative sugar factories in production during 1974-75 season is given in column 6 of the statement referred to in reply to part (a) of this Question.
