**Accelerated urban water supply programme in West Bengal**

2759. SHRI VIVEK GUPTA: Will the MINISTER OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Accelerated urban water supply programme is operational and is being progressively implemented in the country;
- (b) if so, the State-wise details thereof;
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor;
- (d) how many towns of West Bengal are being covered under the programme and what is the amount spent on each town and the target achieved till date; and
- (e) whether there is any plan under consideration to expand the coverage of the programme?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI SAUGATA RAY): (a) The Accelerated Urban Water Supply Programme (AUWSP) has been subsumed under the Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) sub-component of Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) w.e.f. 2005-06 and no new scheme has been approved under AUWSP after FY 2004-05. However, the schemes approved under AUWSP, are still at various stages of implementation. Out of the 1244 schemes approved under this Programme across the country, 1141 schemes have been completed and commissioned, 5 schemes have been dropped and the remaining 98 schemes are under various stages of implementation. The State-wise details of the number of schemes completed and commissioned, the number of schemes under implementation and the number of schemes dropped under AUWSP across the country is given in Statement-I (*See* below).

- (c) Does not arise in view of above.
- (d) Out of the 22 schemes in West Bengal approved under AUWSP, 13 schemes have been completed, 5 schemes are under implementation and the remaining, 4 schemes have been dropped. The details are given in Statement-II (*See* below).
