Socio-economic development works by CIL

*205. SHRI ANIL MADHAV DAVE: Will the Minister of COAL be pleased to state:

(a) the different socio-economic Development works taken up by the Coal India Ltd. (CIL), around mining areas; and

(b) the details of such works taken up during the last five years?

THE MINISTER OF COAL (SHRI SHRIPRAKASH JAISWAL): (a) Company-wise and State-wise different socio economic development activities undertaken around mining areas are furnished below:

(b) The CSR policy has been implemented w.e.f. 2010-11. Prior to that, a comprehensive policy on Community and Peripheral Development was under implementation. Details of the socio-economic development activities undertaken by subsidiaries during last five years are as follows:

ECL:

Details of CSR activities undertaken in mining areas of ECL during the last 5 years are mainly under the head Water Supply, Education, Infrastructure Development and Miscellaneous Activities. The following areas are taken up in ECL under the CSR activities:

- a) Drinking water facility
- b) Education
- c) Solar lighting system
- d) Health and family welfare
- e) Sanitation and public health
- f) Infrastructure development such as construction/repair of community centres/ night shelters/old age homes, building of roads, pathways and bridges
- g) Promotion of sports and games
- h) Setting up of skill development centres
- i) Scholarship to meritorious students belong to SC, ST, OBC & disabled categories
- j) Supplementing development programmes of the Government.

BCCL:

The CSR activities undertaken by BCCL for the socio- economic development around mining areas are as follows:

- a) Providing facilities of drinking water by way of deep bore wells, tube wells, motor pumps etc.
- b) To promote quality education in backward areas by way of construction, extension, renovation of school buildings etc.
- c) Providing Health care by conducting medical camps of peripheral villages. Mobile medical van for providing medical services with provision of free distribution of medicine.
- d) To promote Sports and culture by way of conducting sports, purchase of sports items, construction of children park etc.
- e) The welfare activities which includes construction/Renovation of community Hall, drains, ponds, providing financial assistance for training in different trades of I.T.I, Civil engineering related works and many others.

CCL:

The details of CSR activities undertaken by CCL are as under:

- a) **Adoption & Development of Model Village:** Two villages in the vicinity of Ranchi and one village named Zarri have been adopted for overall development. Rs. 50 lac has been provided for setting up a 'Solar Light Generating Unit' at Zarri.
- b) **Adoption of blind girl child:** 11 blind girls have been adopted for their education and health care. An amount of Rs.2.64 lacs has been provided to the school.
- c) **Promotion of girl child:**
 - Adoption of Girl students of BPL families: 05 Nos.
 - Amount spent for their health & education: Rs. 1.20 Lac.
- d) **Drinking water facilities** by way of installation of hand pumps, digging of wells, ponds, bore hole etc.

- e) **Medical facilities:** Mobile ambulance vans fully equipped with doctors, para medical staff and medicines have been regularly visiting villages for rural health check-up.
- f) **Operation Jyoti:** A programme to eradicate all cases of reversible blindness in the command areas of the company wherein 3610 persons have been benefited.
- g) **CSR Clinic:** There are Fourteen (14) nos. of CSR Clinics opened in the Command Areas of the company for free Medical Treatment to BPL People. 80413 persons have been benefited.
- h) **CSR Ambulance:** There are Nine (9) CSR Ambulances deployed in different areas and around 27351 persons have been benefited.
- i) **Infrastructure:** Roads/School Buildings/Community Centers have been Constructed/repared.

Assistance to State Authorities by way of providing financial grant to the tune of around Rs. 5 crore for construction of High Level Bridge, De-silting of Kanke Dam, Repair/rehabilitation of roads/bridges etc.

NCL:

NCL has been undertaking CSR activities in coal mining areas especially for Modwani village which includes:

- a) Distribution of fruit bearing plants, providing school building with furniture for Modwani Vidyalaya, construction of community Centre, Repairing of drains etc.
- b) Providing Nutrition food and arranging for health camps. Health camps have been conducted in the villages *i.e.* (i) Jaitpur (ii) Modwani (iii) Saraswharaja.
- c) Street Solar light at Modwanighat, Development work of Modwaninala etc.

WCL:

CSR activities undertaken in and around coal mining areas are in the villages adjacent to the mines in Betul & Chhindwara Districts of M.P. Besides the following activities under CSR are being executed:

- a) Construction/repair of Community buildings
- b) Installation/digging of hand pumps/bore wells

- c) Construction of water tanks and laying of pipeline for drinking water
- d) Construction/repair of buildings of educational institutions
- e) Construction/repair of roads, culverts, drainage etc.
- f) Provision of Electrical facilities/ solar lights
- g) Medical camps
- h) Village Sports and games
- i) Assistance to old age home, physically handicapped, orphanage
- j) Other development works

SECL:

SECL has its operational area in seven (7) districts of Chhattisgarh and three (3) of Madhya Pradesh which are primarily dominated by ST population. Details of the major CSR Activities undertaken by SECL during the last five years are mainly under the head of development of education facilities, environmental related work like plantation, oxygen centre, forest depot, medical camps, ambulances etc.

SECL is also implementing works related to development of infrastructure in tribal regions like community hall, lighting, parks as well as development of sports infrastructure like playground, financial assistance to sports tournament etc.

SECL is also implementing works related to providing adequate water supply, for the deepening of ponds, construction of ghats, digging of bore holes and installation of hand pumps etc.

MCL:

MCL has CSR activities in Sundargarh District which is a tribal area. Major CSR activities executed by MCL around mining area consist of the following:

- a) Peripheral grant for Health, Education, Irrigation, Agriculture etc.
- b) Construction of by pass road.
- c) Construction of Girls Hostel having provision of 100 No. of ST Girls accommodation facilities.
- d) Resurfacing of Road from Sundargarh to Bankibahal Chowk at Sundargarh. Length of the Road 37.50 km.
- e) Construction of Pavement with side drains.

CMPDIL:

The CSR activities undertaken by CMPDIL includes construction of community building, installation of hand pumps, digging of wells, renovation and

construction of ponds, repairing/extension of educational buildings, construction/preparation of roads, culverts, drains etc.

Providing solar light, conducting medical camps, distribution of blankets and other materials. HIV/AIDS awareness camps, providing cycle to tribal girl students etc.

Power shortage in Maharashtra

*206. SHRI RAJKUMAR DHOOT: Will the Minister of POWER be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there is severe shortage of power in Maharashtra;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether it is also a fact that incomplete thermal power projects in Vidarbha region have increased this power shortage further;

(d) if so, the details of such projects; and

(e) what action Government proposes to take to ensure that such projects are completed within a definite time-frame?

THE MINISTER OF POWER (SHRI M. VEERAPPA MOILY): (a) and (b) During the current financial year i.e. 2012-13 (upto July, 2012), Maharashtra experienced energy and peak shortage of 4.1% and 6.5% respectively as compared to energy shortage of 14.8% and peak shortage of 18.6% during April to July, 2011. The details power supply position in Maharashtra during April to July, 2012 and April to July, 2011 given below:
