Irregularities of funds by NGOs in the field of healthcare

1145. SHRI DILIPBHAI PANDYA: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of funds provided to Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) in the country including Gujarat in the field of healthcare during each of the last three years and the current year, NGO-wise and State-wise;
- (b) the details of funds utilized by NGOs, State-wise and year-wise;
- (c) whether Utilisation Certificates have been received from NGOs;
- (d) the details of NGOs found involved in various irregularities, State-wise;
- (e) whether Government has taken any action against such NGOs;
- (f) if so, the details thereof; and
- (g) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI A.H. KHAN CHOUDHURY): (a) Public Health is a State subject. However, the Central Government supports the efforts of the State Government financially and technically. The details of funds provided to State Governments/NGOs in the field of health care for the last three years are given in Statement-I (*See below*).

(b) The details of utilisation of funds by Regional Resource Centres and NGOs, and the State-wise utilisation of funds by State AIDS Control Societies are given in Statement-II (*See below*).

(c) Utilization Certificates in respect of fund released by State/District Health Society or State AIDS Control Societies are received by the respective State/District Health Societies. The Utilization Certificates in respect of fund released to Regional Resource Centres and to NGOs under RNTCP programme have been received from the NGOs up to financial Year 2011-12.

(d) to (g) It has been reported that under the National AIDS Control Programme, 36 NGOs have been terminated and funds have been recovered by the State AIDS Control Societies. The details are given in Statement-III.
