Dengue cases in Tamil Nadu

- 542. SHRI S. THANGAVELU: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government is concerned about the increasing number of deaths due to dengue in Tamil Nadu;
- (b) if so, whether Government will send a Central medical team like previous year to assess the situation and to prevent further deaths due to this disease in Tamil Nadu; and
 - (c) if so, the details thereof and action taken by Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI A.H. KHAN CHOUDHURY): (a) Yes.

(b) and (c) Government of India had deputed a multidisciplinary central team to visit Tirunelveli district from 23rd to 26th May, 2012 to assess the situation and for technical guidance to the State to contain the outbreak as maximum number of cases and deaths were reported from this district.

Another Central Team had been deputed to visit dengue affected coastal areas of Tamil Nadu from 23rd November, 2012 onwards to assess the situation and for technical guidance of the State.

Union Health & FW Secretary reviewed the situation in the States with the State Health secretaries including Tamil Nadu on 12th September, 2012.

Committees of Secretaries (CoS) reviewed the situation through video conferencing in Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Pudducherry, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal on 05th October, 2012.

The Union Health & FW Minister also reviewed the dengue situation for the States of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Karnataka and Pudducherry at Chennai on 12th October, 2012.

New strain of polio-like virus
