Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) the States with the maximum population below poverty level as per the Tendulkar Methodology;
- (b) whether any special treatment is envisaged for the upliftment of these States; and
 - (c) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI RAJEEV SHUKLA): (a) As per the poverty ratios for the year 2009-10 estimated following Tendulkar Methodology, Uttar Pradesh has maximum population below poverty level *i.e.*, 7.38 crore followed by Bihar having 5.44 crore population living below poverty line in 2009-10. The details about other States and UTs are given in the Statement (See below).

(b) and (c) The Government is implementing Special Plan in Bihar and Bundelkhand Package in Uttar Pradesh for the upliftment of these States. Also, the allocation under Centrally Sponsored Schemes is in favour of low performing States. Besides, the Government is implementing various schemes for the upliftment of the poor and improve the quality of life of the people in all the States/UTs. Some of the poverty reduction and mitigation programmes are Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), Swarnjayanti Gram Swarozgar Yojana (SGSY), Swarna Jayanti Shahari Rozgar Yojana (SJSRY), National Rural Health Mission (NRHM), Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Mid-Day Meal Scheme (MDMS), Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM), Integrated Child

Development Services (ICDS) Scheme, Rajiv Gandhi Drinking Water Mission, Indira Awaas Yojana (IAY), National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP) and Total Sanitation Campaign etc.
