Shutdown by LPG producing plants

*187. SHRI DIPANKAR MUKHERJEE:†

SHRI CHITTABRATA MAJUMDAR:

Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS be pleased to state:

(a) the details of unforeseen shutdowns in LPG producing plants in public and private sector refineries during last six months, month-wise;

(b) whether a planned shutdown for 45 days was resorted to by Jamnagar Refinery from 4th October, 2005;

(c) if so, its impact on LPG shortage in the country in domestic sector, and

(d) the reason, for permitting such planned shutdown during peak demand in festive season?

† The question was actually asked on the floor of the House by Shri Dipankar mukherjee.

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS (SHRI MANI SHANKAR AIYAR): (a) to (d) A Statement is laid on the Table of the House.

Statement

(a) Due to planned and unforeseen shutdowns by refineries, there has been a reduction in the actual production of LPG *vis-a-vis* production planned originally during the current year. The month-wise details of production of LPG for the period April-October, 2005 are given in the Statement-I (See below).

The details of shutdowns, planned and unforeseen, of various major units in public and private sector refineries during April-October, 2005 are given in Statement-I I (See below).

(b) A planned shutdown for Reliance India Limited (RIL) Refinery at Jamnagar was taken with effect from 4th October, 2005. Production was restored on 1 st December, 2005.

(c) As the Jamnagar Refinery accounts for about one-third of the domestic production of LPG the Reliance shutdown made it necessary to effect imports at just the time the international market for LPG was severely hit by hurricanes like Katrina, Rita and Wilmar and ONGC gas production was temporarily affected by the BHN fire.

(d) While the planned shutdown of the refineries is essential for maintenance requirements and the safety of refinery units, and the permission of the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas is not required for such shutdowns, it is a fact that the Reliance shutdown was initially planned for April-May, later changed to August-September and finally took place in October-November, 2005. Precisely because the shutdown was eventually scheduled for the festive season, the Ministry proactively interacted with Reliance to further postpone the shutdown. Reliance pleaded that for technical reasons, it was not possible for them to shift the shutdown till after the festive season. Repeated postponements and the decision to close down at the height of the festive season certainly complicated matters for the OMCs as Reliance accounts for nearly one-third of domestic LPG production.

(vii) indicate the likely investment on infrastructure development under different heads; and
