**Supply of fake medicines**

3176. SHRI RAM KRIPAL YADAV: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government is aware that fake medicines are available in the market openly these days;

(b) whether it is also a fact that even fake medicines have been supplied to Government Dispensaries and Hospitals and Army Hospitals; and

(c) if so, the details of those cases reported to Government during the last two years and the action taken in this matter so far?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI GHULAM NABI AZAD): (a) to (c) There are no such reports that fake medicines are available in the market openly. There is no report also from Central Government Health Services (CGHS) about supply of fake medicines. The requisite information about the Army Hospitals is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House. One case of supply of medicines with no efficacy in the Government Hospitals of Jammu & Kashmir has been brought to the notice of the Central Government. The State Government of Jammu & Kashmir is taking appropriate legal action.
