

**Accidental deaths and injury in work place and worksite**

2294. SHRI RAMA CHANDRA KHUNTIA: Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the number of accidental death and injury in workplace and worksite has increased in the country especially in two building collapses in Mumbai, Delhi and Goa and Bhushan Steel Plant in Odisha; and

(b) the State-wise and industry-wise detailed list of industrial, mining and construction worksite deaths and injury in the last three years?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI KODIKUNNIL SURESH): (a) and (b) The provisions of safety and health aspect of the workers engaged in building and other construction work are enforced by the Central and State Governments in their respective spheres. State-wise details of the workers died and injured during the last three years on the worksites is given in the Statement.
