Reported casualties in family planning operations

1044. SHRIMATI SAROJINI HEMBRAM: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is aware that a number of complaints are reported to

have been lodged on the fact that after the Family Planning operations/ surgeries, lot of people are either dying or falling seriously ill in different parts of our country;

(b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise; and

(c) if not, whether Government has introduced any new techniques/technology for such types of surgery?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA): (a) and (b) No. Since health is a State subject, complaints are handled by the State Government.

However, the Government is aware of only one such case which has occurred recently in the State of Chhattisgarh where some people died and fell seriously ill after family planning operations.

(c) Government has not introduced any new techniques/technology for such types of surgery.

Development of Ebola vaccine

†1045. SHRI MAHENDRA SINGH MAHRA: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) the names of the places where the patients of Ebola have been found and the details thereof, State-wise;

(b) whether Government has invented vaccine to get rid of Ebola virus; and

(c) if not, the details of the steps taken to save from this disease?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA): (a) No case of Ebola Virus Disease has been reported in India so far.

(b) No.

(c) Government has taken a series of measures to prevent entry of Ebola Virus Disease into the country and to contain it rapidly, if a case is reported in India.

There is screening of passengers coming from affected countries at international airports and majorports. The Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme is tracking
