

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA): (a) and (b) The proposal to launch National Health Assurance Mission is currently under examination. The proposal envisages that under the proposed Mission, Unique ID card could eventually become the means for establishing identity as needed by the system.

(c) and (d) Based on decision taken, the Central Government has issued instructions on 16.10.2014 to Telecom Service providers to collect "Aadhaar Numbers" along with Customer Application Form while issuing mobile telephone connections and to store the same in their database along with other data.

Amendment in MCI Act

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA): (a) to (d) No. However, A Group of Experts has been constituted to study the existing Indian Medical Council (IMC) Act, 1956 and to look at the proposed amendments to the Act and also to make recommendations to the Government to make the Medical Council of India (MCI) modern and suited to the prevailing conditions.

Shortage of faculty members in medical colleges

Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has released ₹ 716.94 crore to 72 State Government Medical Colleges across 20 States under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme “Strengthening/up-gradation of State Government Medical Colleges for starting new PG courses/creating PG seats”. Fund sharing between the Central and State Government is in the ratio of 75:25 under the scheme. Funds are provided to the Government Medical Colleges for infrastructure development, faculty and equipment. In addition to this scheme, a new Centrally Sponsored Scheme namely “Strengthening and up gradation of State Government Medical Colleges for increase in intake capacity of MBBS seats” has also been approved this year. The scheme has the provision of fund sharing between the Central Government and States in the ratio of 90:10 for NE/Special Category States and 70:30 for other States.
