- (a) India's assessment of the progress made in successive rounds since 2005 of the biennial round-table discussions between Asian suppliers and consumers of oil and natural gas under the aegis of the International Energy Forum, Riyadh; and
- (b) what initiatives Government have under consideration for the next round, given the dramatic changes in recent years in the global oil and gas scenario?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS (SHRI DHARMENDRA PRADHAN): (a) and (b) The Government encourages engagements at multiple levels with oil and gas producing countries and global multi-lateral organizations active in the energy domain on a continuing basis, as a part of the overall policy efforts towards boosting India's energy security. India's dialogue with the member countries of International Energy Forum (IEF) has been useful from the point of view of gaining an enhanced understanding of global energy dynamics, particularly in the context of high crude/gas prices prevalent till mid-2014 and the volatility in the crude markets since mid-2014.
