THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI MOHANBHAI KALYANJIBHAI KUNDARIYA): (a) and (b) In the month of February-May, 2015 many States like Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Bihar,

Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Karnataka and Telangana were hit by hailstorm accompanied by unseasonal rainfall, these States submitted Memoranda seeking financial assistance from National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) in the wake of hailstorms. The main Rabi Crops affected are wheat, maize, mustard, gram, pea, lentil, vegetables, etc. Department of Agriculture and Cooperation (DAC) had constituted inter-Ministerial Central Teams (IMCTs) to visit the affected areas for assessment of the ground situation and recommendation of financial assistance. Details of financial assistance sought/ approved from the NDRF and amount released from SDRF for hailstorms affected State is given in the Statement (See below).

In order to protect farmers against crop failure due to natural calamities, pest and diseases, weather conditions, Government of India has recently introduced the National Crop Insurance Scheme (NCIP) with component schemes of Modified National Agricultural insurance Scheme (MNAIS), Weather Based Crop insurance Scheme (WBCIS) and Coconut Palm Insurance Scheme (CPIS). National Agricultural Insurance Scheme (NAIS) which was withdrawn from Rabi 2013-14, have also been continued for its implementation. ₹ 42132.41 lakh has paid under MNAIS to States of Karnataka (₹ 106.97 lakh) and Uttar Pradesh (₹ 42025.44 lakh). ₹ 63642.37 lakh have been paid under WBCIS to the States of Karnataka (₹ 936.99 lakh), Madhya Pradesh (₹ 1341.74 lakh), Maharashtra (₹ 4676.72 lakh), Rajasthan (₹ 54157.11 lakh), Uttar Pradesh (₹ 2486.45 lakh) and Uttarakhand (₹ 43.36 lakh).
