Files pending in SICs

1206. SHRI D. RAJA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that thousands of appeals filed in various State Information Commissions (SICs) in the country are pending for hearing and majority of these SICs have not displayed their annual reports on their websites for the financial year 2013-14; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof and what measures are being taken to improve the functioning of the SICs?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE (DR. JITENDRA SINGH): (a) and (b) Section 15 of the Right to Information Act, 2005 provides that every State Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, constitute a State Information Commission to exercise the powers conferred on and to perform the functions assigned to it under this Act. State-wise data on pending cases and annual reports are available in each State Information Commission.

Reduction in number of CSSs

1207. DR. CHANDAN MITRA: SHRI A.W. RABI BERNARD: SHRI PANKAJ BORA:

Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has decided to reduce the number of Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSSs) from the current 72 to about 30, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether a cut in the number of CSS would be the first major decision of a panel under the newly constituted National Institution for Transforming India (NITI) Aayog; and
- (c) whether many States expressed concern about the reduction in Union Government's support towards Centrally Sponsored Schemes, which were locally relevant and too politically sensitive to be scaled down and if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (RAO INDERJIT SINGH): (a) to (c) As per decision taken in the first meeting of Governing Council of NITI Aayog, held on February 8, 2015, a Sub-Group of

Chief Ministers on Rationalization of Centrally Sponsored Schemes was constituted on March 9, 2015 to look into the following issues i) To examine the existing CSSs and recommend measures for ensuring that their implementation is streamlined and adequately flexible; (ii) In light of the Finance Commission recommendations, the increased devolution of taxes to States and the higher revenue deficit grants to suggest reforms of the Schemes which are being continued under CSSs; (iii) To recommend appropriate measures for coordination between the Centre and the States and among the States for achieving the objectives of the Schemes; (iv) Any other measures related to the schemes to strengthen the national development agenda and ensure outcomes.

Sub-Group of Chief Ministers on Rationalization of Centrally Sponsored Schemes is yet to submit its report. In the budget of 2014-15, provisions were made for 66 Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) of which 17 were flagship Schemes following the restructuring exercise carried out in 2013. However, in the budgetary proposal of 2015-16, existing CSSs have been classified into four categories.

Category A: Centrally Sponsored Schemes placed in this category are proposed to be implemented with full Central support.

Category B: Funding pattern of Centrally Sponsored Schemes placed in this category are proposed to be changed.

Category C: Centrally Sponsored Schemes placed in this category are delinked from Union support and States may decide to continue or not from their own resources.

Category D: Schemes placed in this category are part of devolution to the States or have been restructured and amalgamated among Schemes in A, B or C.

Relevant extract of the budgetary proposal of 2015-16 is given in the Statement (See below).

Following the acceptance of recommendations of the 14th Finance Commission of raising the devolution of net tax receipt from 32% to 42%, the fiscal space available with Central Government to fund Centrally Sponsored Scheme has been reduced.
