102: SHRI RAMA MUNI REDDY SIRIGIREDDY: Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Food Corporation of India is all set to adopt a slew of new practices and procedures to distribute quality foodgrains in the country;

(b) if so, the details of the procedures to be followed by FCI to effectively supply foodgrains in the country;

(c) whether it is a fact that FCI is also thinking of borrowing resources from the market with a guarantee from Government; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (DR. AKHILESH PRASAD SINGH): (a) and (b) As per the procedure in vogue, stock of foodgrains are issued to State/UT Governments only after their satisfaction about quality through a Joint Sampling Method.

(c) Yes, Sir.

(d) Food Corporation of India has sought approval for market borrowing of Rs. 5000 crores in stage. The FCI has also requested Government of India to provide guarantee for market borrowings.
