#### **H-1B visa cap imposed by U.S.**

426. SHRIMATI N.P. DURGA : Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of H-1B visa cap imposed by US for IT companies;
- (b) whether after the end of the period of H-1B visa, pending applications for Green Card, H-1B visa holder would allowed to stay in US and work;
- (c) if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the number of software professional who has entered USA on H-1B visas during the last three years, year-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI RAO INDERJIT SINGH): (a) The Government of U.S.A. has imposed a cap of 65,000 jobs for IT companies. 50,000 visas have been granted and would join after 1 October, 2004. Remaining 15,000 visas are in process.

(b) and (c) H-1B visa holders would be allowed to stay in U.S.A. only if their labour certification application is approved by the State or labour certification was filed one year prior to expiry of H-1B visa. In late cases extension will be granted for one year each time until labour department finally clears the application.

(d) In 2001, 2002 and 2003 approximately 2,50,000 Indian IT professionals entered in U.S.A. The year-wise break up is not available with the Government of India.
