Removal of speed breakers from highways

- 1691. SHRI RAM KUMAR KASHYAP: Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the speed breakers hinder the traffic flow and are safety hazards on high-speed corridors;
 - (b) if so, the steps taken to remove speed breakers from highways;
- (c) the total number of accidents which occurred on highways due to speed breakers and the number of persons killed therein;
- (d) whether there is any proposal to construct foot over-bridges and pedestrian underpasses on highways to prevent accidents; and
- (e) if so, the details of sites where Government intends to construct foot overbridges and pedestrian underpasses on highways?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS (SHRI RADHAKRISHNAN P.): (a) and (b) Speed breakers on high speed corridors besides hindering traffic flow cause accidents in some cases. Ministry has been time and again requesting all the states and executing agencies to remove speed breakers from National Highways as National Highways are high speed facilities for movement of goods and passengers. Latest such circular request is issued *vide* No.RW/NH-33037/01/2016/S and R (R) dated 11.04.2016 to all the State PWDs, National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), Border Roads Organization, all the States/UTs and other executing agencies.

- (c) State-wise details of Number of accidents and fatalities which occurred during the last three years (2012, 2013, 2014) due to speed breakers are given in the Statement (See below).
- (d) and (e) Ministry had requested all the executing agencies to explore possibilities of Foot over Bridges and pedestrian underpasses to prevent direct crossing of National Highways by pedestrians in the above said circular request. Further, National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has decided to construct Foot over Bridges or pedestrian underpasses wherever required as per site conditions for which simplified policy guidelines have been circulated by NHAI in March 2016. The work of Foot over Bridges by NHAI is targeted to be completed by September 2016.
