THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARJUN SINGH): (a) to (c) Based on requirements projected by States, about 5.35 lakh posts of additional elementary teachers were approved for Central assistance during last three financial years, to meet requirements of elementary education of satisfactory quality. State-wise numbers of posts approved is given in the enclosed statement (*see below*).

(c) how many agreements have been reached and the steps being taken to implement them;

(d) the amount of aid Japan has provided; and

(e) how far the aid has been utilised?
