THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SIS RAM OLA): (a) and (b) Improvement in quality of labour with a view to increase the productivity envisages skill development retraining, redeployment, updating knowledge-base of worker teachers, social security measures, creation of healthy work environment etc. Various labour laws and schemes are geared towards attainment of these objectives.

(a) whether Government have made an assessment of the number of people seeking employment in urban areas of the country;

(b) if so, the total number of unemployed persons in urban areas together with the number of persons out of them who are XII class passed or more;

(c) the names of the top ten States of the country with the highest number of unemployed persons; and

(d) the percentage of the unemployed persons to the total number of job seekers in the respective States?

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SIS RAM OLA): (a) There are around 4.12 crore job seekers registered with the employment exchanges in the country. Out of these, around 42% are in the urban area.

(b) Number of jobseekers having XII class passed and above qualifications as on 31-12-2002 (latest available) were around 1.28 crore.

(c) Top ten States with highest number of job seekers as on 30th April, 2004 were West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Assam and Jharkhand.

(d) Based on the survey conducted on activity status of jobseekers and report published in 1990, the percentage of unemployed persons to the jobseekers in these States is given in the enclosed Statement.

(a) whether it is a fact that the solution to the problem of severe unemployment prevailing in the rural areas of the country lies in the industrial development;

(b) if so, Government's reaction thereto;

(c) whether any incentive scheme has been formulated by Government to give preference to the use of labour oriented technique in establishment of industrial units in the country;

(d) if so, the details thereof; and

(e) the number of additional employment likely to be created in this sector during the year 2004-05?

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SIS RAM OLA): (a), (b) and (e) The Tenth Plan document outlines the approach and strategy of the Government to tackle the problem of severe unemployment in the country. Major areas identified for the purpose include Agriculture, Irrigation, Agro Forestry, Small and Medium Enterprises, Information and Communication Technology, Tourism and other services. Creation of around one crore employment opportunities per year, on an average is being targeted during each year of the Tenth Plan *i.e.* 2002—07.

(c) Ministry of Labour and Employment is not aware of any such scheme.
