Seeping of sea water in Neyveli

1633. SHRI T.T.V. DHINAKARAN: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that there is a fear of seeping in sea water in Neyveli region of Tamil Nadu due to pumping out of huge quantity of water from the Neyveli Lignite Corporation's mines;

(b) whether Government have conducted any survey to investigate the matter; and

(c) whether there are any norms with regard to the pumping of water from deep mines?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COAL AND MINES (DR. DASARI NARAYAN RAO): (a) Yes, Sir. The Government is aware of the possibility of seeping in of sea water due to pumping out of water from mines.

(b) The Central Ground Water Board, at the request of Neyveli Lignite Corporation Ltd. (NLC), has put up observation wells along the coast to continuously monitor any salt water intrusion from sea to inland and the studies made so far indicate that there is no such occurrence. NLC has also requested Geological Survey of India to undertake scientific studies in Neyveli region so as to understand seeping of sea water, if any, due to pumping by NLC for mining operations, agriculturists and other industries operating in the region.

(c) Yes, Sir. Ministry of Environment and Forests and the Central Ground Water Board have prescribed the limits restricting ground water pumping from NLC's mines. NLC is pumping ground water to the extent it has been permitted by the above agencies.
