

Human Rights abuses in Iraq

#*350. SHRI TARIQ ANWAR: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that thousands of Indians in Iraq are suffering from Human Rights abuses;

(b) if so the details thereof;

(c) whether many Indians are illegally detained there; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI E. AHAMED): (a) to (d) Government has no information that thousands of Indians in Iraq are suffering from human rights abuses. However, the Government has received occasion complaints from Indian workers alleging ill-treatment and exploitation by their employers in Iraq. Such instance have been taken up with concerned employer/contractor, and assistance extended in repatriating the interested Indian workers. Government has no information of many Indians being illegally detained in Iraq.
