Increasing the speed of trains connecting Southern India

- †3481. DR. CHANDRAPAL SINGH YADAV: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) the names of railway routes identified for running of trains at high speed in the country;
- (b) whether Government is contemplating enhancing the speed of long distance Trains connecting Southern India; and
 - (c) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI RAJEN GOHAIN): (a) and (b) Indian Railways has identified nine routes for increasing the speed of passenger trains to 160/200 kmph. These routes are, New Delhi – Agra, New Delhi – Chandigarh, New Delhi – Kanpur, Chennai – Bengaluru-Mysore, Nagpur – Secunderabad, Nagpur – Bilaspur, Mumbai – Goa, Mumbai – Ahmedabad and Chennai – Hyderabad.

(c) ERYUAN Group of China was entrusted with feasibility study for increasing the speed of passenger trains to 160 kmph on existing Chennai – Bengaluru – Mysore route.

A protocol has been signed on 15.10.2016 between Ministry of Railways of India and Ministry of Railways of Russia for carrying out feasibility study of existing Nagpur – Secunderabad Corridor for raising the speed of passenger trains to 200 kmph.
