(d) and (e) The Government does not set up any Agri-Clinics and Agri-Business Centres on its own. However, as informed by the Ministry of Agriculture, they are promoting Agri-Clinics and Agri-Business Centres through the Central Sector Scheme 'Establishment of a network of Agri-Clinics and Agri-Business Centres' which aims at extending opportunities to all eligible agricultural graduates to support agriculture development through economically viable ventures which will be set up by them with the help of bank loan.

So far 8 Agri-Clinics and Agri-Business Centres have been set up in Kerala. However, there is no proposal for Agri-Clinics and Agri-Business Centres to establish godowns in rural areas.

Disposal of radio-active sources

1627. SHRIMATI KAMLAMANHAR: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to State:

(a) whether the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) is facing any problem in disposal of radio-active sources used for medical purposes in India;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) The Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC) has established procedures for disposal of such sources. These sources are transported in sealed flasks and disposed in tile holes designed for such waste disposal.
