(b) whether it is a fact that pesticides are used mostly by women working in the agriculture fields; and

(c) if so, the impact of pesticides on the health of women working in farms?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE (SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA): (a) No, Sir. As per the data provided by the States in the Zonal Conferences, the consumption of pesticides has shown a decline from 60282 M.T (Technical Grade) in 2013-14 to 50409 M.T (Technical Grade) in 2015-16.

(b) and (c) The pesticides are used by both men and women farmers. However, there is no specific information on the use of pesticides by women farmers only. Under the Insecticide Act, 1968 and rules made therein, pesticides are registered after evaluating the safety of the product with respect to human health. Pesticides used in accordance with instructions on labels and leaflets, are unlikely to cause any harm to health and environment.

Implementation of PMFBY in Madhya Pradesh

(a) whether Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) has been implemented in all 51 districts of Madhya Pradesh;

(b) if so, the crop insurance companies identified for implementation of the Yojana in all 51 districts, the details thereof;

(c) the number of farmers in Madhya Pradesh registered under the Yojana whose premium is being deposited by the Central Government/agencies and State Government/agencies; and

(d) the district-wise break-up with total premium collected from these farmers including in respective ratios of deposit?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE (SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA): (a) to (d) Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) has been notified by the State Government of Madhya Pradesh in all the 51 districts of the State. All the districts have been divided in to 5 clusters. Three clusters (31 districts) have been allotted for three years from Kharif 2016 to Agriculture Insurance Company of India Ltd. and one cluster each to HDFC-ERGO General Insurance Company Ltd. (10 districts) and ICICI-Lombard General Insurance Company Ltd. (10 districts) through a bidding process.
