Tele-density

1655. SHRI EKANATH K. THAKUR: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware of the fact that almost half of the country *i.e.* 13 out of 27 circles) has missed the telecom revolution and have a much lower tele-density than the pan-Indian average of 7.02 as on the 31st March, 2004;

(b) whether it is a fact that the telephonic penetration per 100 people in these 13 circles ranged between 1.5 and 5; and

(c) if so, the efforts Government propose to make so that the telecom revolution reaches everywhere?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (DR. SHAKEEL AHMAD): (a) and (b) As per statistics available, 13 circles have registered a teledensity ranging between 1.5 and 5.

(c) Telecom Services, both landline and mobile, are available in all the circles. The teledensity in different regions is a function of demand. Government are working towards doubling the current teledensity levels in the next two years or so.
