THE MINISTER OF TEXTILES (SHRIMATI SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI): (a) and (b) The Government of India through Ministry of Textiles, office of Development Commissioner for Handlooms is providing training to handloom weavers/workers for upgrading their skills in weaving, dyeing/printing and designing under Skill upgradation programme of Block Level Cluster, a component of National Handloom Development Progarmme (NHDP) and Comprehensive Handloom Cluster Development Scheme (CHCDS) to enable them to produce market driven/diversified range of products.
