(c) and (d) As adequate stock of sugar is available in the country in 2003-2004 (sugar season) for domestic consumption, no proposal for import of sugar is under consideration of the Government.

#### **Smart card system**

1820. SHRI SANJAY RAJARAM RAUT: Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Tenth Plan Working Group on Public Distribution System and Food Security has recommended introduction of smart card system in the form of a credit or debit card instead of the existing ration cards to eliminate the rampant corruption in the PDS in the country;

(b) if so, Government's views thereon;

(c) whether Government propose to introduce such smart card system in the country; and

(d) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (DR. AKHILESH PRASAD SINGH): (a) The Tenth Plan Working Group on the Public Distribution System and Food Security had recommended introduction of Smart Card system in the form of credit/debit card instead of the existing ration cards in the PDS in the Country.

(b) to (d) Based on the recommendations of the Working Group a Pilot Project on implementation of Smart Cards in PDS, later on renamed as "implementation of Food Credit Cards in PDS" has been formulated for implementation in selected districts/States. The Scheme is being implemented on a pilot basis in Vidisha, Kangra and Ernakulam districts of Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Kerala respectively. The introduction of the Food Credit Cards in the whole country will depend on the outcome of the Pilot Project.
