

**Electronic telephone exchanges in Nagaland**

- (a) the details of the electronic telephone exchanges set up during the last three years in the State of Nagaland;

- (c) by when, these telephone exchanges would be set up in the State **and** what steps are being taken by Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (DR. SHAKEEL AHMAD): (a) Number of electronic telephone exchanges set up during the last three years in Nagaland are as under —

2001-02	3 [Sechu, Kohima & Chekiya]
2002-03	3 [Longleng, Noklak & Kohima UHF(RSU)]
2003-04	1 [Khonoma]

(b) and (c) Now new electronic telephone exchange is planned to be set up during next two years *i.e.* 2004-05, 2005-06 as sufficient switching capacity is available.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (DR. SHAKEELAHMAD):

(a) There are 56230 working telephones in Nagaland.

(b) The district-wise waiting list in Nagaland as on 30th June, 2004 is given below —

(c) and (d) The waiting list is due to demand from places where there is no telecom infrastructure in a particular period. The generation of demand is a continuous process which keeps adding to the waiting list. As such, a target date for clearing the waiting list which is a dynamic process cannot be set. To clear the pending waiting list as well as to cater to the fresh demand, BSNL has planned 26000 new telephone connections through fixed lines, WLL (Wireless in Local Loop) and cellular mobile phones in Nagaland during 2004-05.
