areas. The SGRY is open for all rural poor who are in need of wage employment and desire to do manual and unskilled work in and around his village/habitat.

Agro-based industries in Uttaranchal

- †*453. SHRI HARISH RAWAT: Will the Minister of AGRO AND RURAL INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:
- (a) the number of small and tiny agro based industries alongwith the number of persons employed therein in Uttaranchal;
- (b) whether Government are aware of the fact that a large number of such small cottage and rural industries have been closed down during last few years; and

- (b) No, Sir. However, some units do close down.
- (c) Such information is not maintained centrally.

An outlay of Rs. 1062.05 crores out of a total plan outlay of Rs.1350 crores allotted to the Department has been earmarked for the modernisation activities in the Tenth Five Year Plan.
