

STPs constructed under AMRUT

†*63 SHRI MAHENDRA SINGH MAHRA: Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the details of Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) constructed/under construction in 2014-15 out of the total STPs proposed to be constructed during the period 2014-17, State-wise;

(b) the total number of STPs constructed under Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) till October, 2017, State-wise;

(c) the additional sewage treatment capacity added through STPs constructed during the above period; and

(d) whether the gap between sewage generation and sewage treatment capacity still exists in the urban areas and if so, the action plan of Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS (SHRI HARDEEP SINGH PURI): (a) 80 Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) with total capacity of 1,753 Million Litres per Day (MLD), in which 50% or more of the Approved Central Assistance (ACA) had been released and physical progress was 50% or more as on 31.03.2014 or were sanctioned during transition phase of the earlier Mission, were approved for funding under Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT). The State-wise details of these STPs, which were taken for construction in subsequent years are given in Statement-I (*See below*).

(b) Till October, 2017, work on 29 STPs with a total treatment capacity of 1,065 MLD have been constructed under AMRUT Mission; their State-wise details are given in Statement-II (*See below*).

(c) During the period from 2014-15 till date, 1,065 MLD treatment capacity has been added under AMRUT. Further, 133 MLD treatment capacity has been added under Namami Gange Programme, and 293 MLD capacity has been added under National River Conservation Plan (NRCP).

(d) As per the data released in the report "Inventorisation of Sewage Treatment Plants 2015" by the Central Pollution Control Board, the total sewage generation in the urban areas in the country was 62,000 MLD, and the treatment capacity in that year was 23,277 MLD.

Under AMRUT Mission, additional treatment capacity of 3,127 MLD will be added on completion of 153 STPs, which are at different stages of implementation. Further, 2,625 MLD treatment capacity will be added on completion of 77 sewerage

infrastructure projects under Namami Gange Programme and 647 MLD capacity will be added on construction of 20 projects under National River Conservation Plan, which are also at various stages of implementation.

In addition to the above Sewage Treatment Plants, Faecal Sludge and Septage Management Projects are also implemented to address the waste water disposal/processing. Under AMRUT Mission 8 Septage Management Projects with a total treatment capacity of 25 MLD have been sanctioned and are at various stages of implementation.

(b) and (c) The National Heritage City Development and Augmentation Yojana (HRIDAY), a Central Sector scheme with a total outlay of ₹ 500 crore was launched on 21 January, 2015. The scheme's objective is to preserve and revitalize the soul and unique character of the heritage cities in India. The nature of projects taken up under the scheme is development of water supply/sanitation/drainage/approach roads/footpaths, street lights/toilets/underground electricity wiring and landscaping.
