†2440. SHRI AJAY MAROO: Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that around Rs.280 crores of National Rural Employment Guarantee Yojana is lying unspent with Jharkhand Government:
- (b) if so, whether any clarification has been given by the State Government in this regard; and
 - (c) if not, the action being taken by Central Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHANDRA SEKHAR SAHU): (a) NREGA is a demand based programme. Work is to be provided to a registered job seeker having a job card within 15 days of the demand. Funds are released to the districts on submission of a proposal along with a certificate indicating utilization of atleast 60% of the available resources. Unspent balance at the end of the financial year is carried forward to the next financial year as opening balance for that year. During the year 2006-07, the State had spent Rs. 711.55 crores out of the total available funds of Rs.982.21 crore. During 2007-08, the State has, so far, spent Rs.270.28 crores out of the total available funds of Rs.617.16 crores.
