With a view to provide an effective regime for prohibition of benami transactions, the Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Amendment Act, 2016 came into force with effect from 1st November, 2016.

Unstarred Questions

As a result of these and other Governance measures, recent reports of several internationally reputed institutions have shown an encouraging improvement in India's ratings/ranking on various Governance related parameters.

As per the World Bank's Doing Business Report published in October 2017, India's ranking on Ease of Doing Business improved significantly to 100 (out of 190 countries) as against 130 in previous year.

In addition, Moody's Investors Service (Moody's) report has upgraded Government of India's local and foreign currency issuer ratings to Baa2 from Baa3.

## Expenditure on social sector and infrastructure

4428. SHRI SANJAY RAUT: Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that various State Governments are spending more than 40 per cent of their earnings on salaries and pensions;
  - (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise;
- (c) how much amount and percentage has been spent on various social sectors and infrastructure development by various State Governments from their earnings; and
- (d) the details of the steps taken or proposed to be taken by Government for more expenditure on social sectors and infrastructure developments in the country?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (RAO INDERJIT SINGH): (a) and (b) During 2016-17 BE, the expenditure on salaries and pension as a proportion to their revenue receipts is more than 40% in the case of 13 States. The details of State-wise expenditure on salaries and pension as a proportion to the revenue receipts is given in Statement-I (See below).

- (c) During 2016-17 BE, the amount and percentage of expenditure on social sector and infrastructure development as a percentage to the revenue receipts is given in Statement-II (See below).
- (d) The Central Government has been providing for the need for greater thrust for improvement in social sectors and infrastructure by providing increased untied resources through devolution which went up from 32% earlier to 42 % from 2015-16. In addition to the untied resources, the transfer of resources to states through various

specific Centrally Sponsored Schemes are also aimed at improvement of the social sectors and infrastructure by the State Governments along with the States' own resources.
