(e) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES (SHRI ANANT GEETE): (a) and (b) There are 31 Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) under the Department of Heavy Industry (DHI), out of which, 13 CPSEs are incurring losses. DHI reviews functioning of CPSEs under its administrative control from time to time and appropriate decision/response to the performance of individual CPSEs (loss making or otherwise) is determined in consultation with stakeholders. Several revival packages (financial and non-financial support) have been provided to the loss making CPSEs.

- (c) Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL) having 17 manufacturing units in different parts of India (including Tiruchirapalli and Thirumayam) reported loss during the financial year 2015-16, which was mainly due to a subdued business environment resulting in reduced level of operations and profitability. However, in 2016-17 BHEL has returned to profits with PBT (Profit Before Tax) of ₹ 628 crore. Towards this, most of the manufacturing units including Tiruchirapalli and Thirumayam, contributed positively. Various actions including cost optimisation, faster execution, enhancement in executable orders etc. were the steps which helped in improving the profitability of BHEL in 2016-17.
 - (d) and (e) There is no such proposal under consideration at present in BHEL.

Claims for individual and community forest rights

*418. SHRI TIRUCHI SIVA: Will the Minister of TRIBAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Community Forest Right (CFR) claims filed under the Forest Rights Act, 2006, so far, and the number of such claims recognised, State-wise; and
- (b) the number of Individual Forest Right (IFR) claims filed, so far, and the number of such claims recognised, State-wise and the number of such claims recognised for women, including single women?

THE MINISTER OF TRIBAL AFFAIRS (SHRI JUAL ORAM): (a) and (b) Statewise number of individual and community claims received, number of titles distributed under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 (FRA in brief), as on 30.11.2017 is furnished in the Statement (See below). In so far as filing of claims and recognition of rights of women is concerned, Section 4 (4) of the FRA provides that "right conferred by sub Section (1) shall be heritable but not alienable or transferable and shall be registered jointly in the name of both the spouses in case of married persons and in

the name of single head in the case of a household headed by a single person and in the absence of a direct heir, the heritable right shall pass on to the next-of kin". Thus in case of married women, rights are registered jointly in the name of both spouses. As regards single women, there is no data available regarding any claims for rights received and recognized in respect of single women heading households.
